The post doc will work with Drs. Marc Brackett and Sigal Barsade on creating an innovative ability test of emotional intelligence. We are looking for applicants with interest in emotion regulation science and emotional labor, and a strong testing background.

Specifically, the postdoctoral associate will be responsible for contributing to test design, validation, execution and analyses associated with the assessment. The postdoctoral associate will support PIs housed at both the YCEI and Wharton across both test development and validation. The postdoctoral associate will be expected to contribute heavily to the production of scholarly artifacts from these data, including empirical articles and disseminating findings to the scholarly community. As a key member of our larger research team, we seek a dynamic and detail-oriented researcher who can be our thought partner and team player, with demonstrated ability to manage time and work demands efficiently.
