

PhD Position

The Affective Neuroscience Lab at the University of Innsbruck (Austria) is considering applications for a funded 4-year PhD position. The PhD student will contribute to several programs of research in the lab, including the cognitive and neural mechanisms involved in emotion regulation, emotion, and social decision-making. The position is designed for a talented and productive researcher with a MA in psychology, neuroscience, or a related field, who takes innovative approaches to the study of social cognitive and/or affective processes and their neural basis. This opportunity provides a transition to career independence through the development of professional skills; supervision by a faculty mentor incorporating an individual development plan in support of training goals; and publication of research findings.

The position involves

- conducting research and performing fMRI experiments;
- analyzing fMRI data;
- preparing and presenting reports of research results;
- presenting the findings at international conferences.

Requirements and Skills

- Excellent master and doctoral degree in psychology, cognitive neuroscience, cognitive science, or an equivalent discipline
- High motivation and interest in interdisciplinary research
- Solid background in statistical analysis
- Of advantage is a background in any of the following areas:
 - knowledge of neuroscientific methods (fMRI, EEG)
 - knowledge of eye-tracking
 - programming experience (e.g. Matlab, Python)
