Executive Summary

Enthusiastic university **Teaching Fellow in Psychology** / **Neuroscience** (part-time, 30% FTE) who wishes to contribute innovative small-group teaching for students on the BSc in Psychology at Forward College, Lisbon Campus.

<u>Forward College</u> is an accredited Teaching Centre for the University of London, and the BSc in Psychology is designed by King's College, London, and degrees are awarded by the University of London.

We are looking for an experienced University Lecturer / Teaching Fellow, educated to PhD level, to provide teaching in the following 1st-year modules on the BSc in Psychology:

- Research Design and Statistics for Psychology (20 weeks) and/or
- Biological Psychology (10 weeks)

This is a part-time contract (30% FTE for both modules, or 20% + 10% FTE for separate modules) on the basis of an annual salary of 36'000 EUR. The contract is for one year (12 months) initially, beginning on October 1 2021, with the possibility of renewal from 1 Oct 2022. Additional teaching hours may be available for the academic year 2022–23.
