We are excited to announce a newly opened full-time Research Coordinator in the Psychology Department at the University of Virginia, located in Charlottesville, Virginia near the beautiful Shenandoah National Park and Blue Ridge Parkway. This position will be joint between the [Emotion and Behavior Lab](#), run by Dr. Adrienne Wood, and the brand-new [Virginia Affect and Interoception Lab](#), run by Dr. Jennifer MacCormack, both in the Social Psychology area. Time will be split evenly between the two labs.

Primary responsibilities include planning and overseeing data collection for a large mobile sensing and social network study in the Emotion and Behavior Lab as well as assisting with new experiments testing psychophysiological and interoceptive effects on emotion, sociality, and cognition in the Virginia Affect and Interoception Lab.

Candidates should have a history of prior research experience in psychology or a related field. Although not required, candidates with a prior history of research experience in emotion, social behaviors, social networks, psychophysiology, interoception, or health may be especially well-suited for this role. Additional recommended (but not required) proficiencies include conducting basic statistical analyses in R, programming in Matlab or Python, or programming study paradigms in PsychoPy or Eprime.

This position begins July 2022 and will last for one year, with the potential for a second year extension. Candidates from underrepresented backgrounds are especially encouraged to apply.
