

Society for Affective Science 2023 OSF Meetings: Upload Instructions

What is OSF Meetings? It is an online repository where presenters can share their conference materials (i.e., abstracts, presentation slides, and/or video recordings of their presentations). You can also add supplementary data, code, preprints, or other material alongside your conference materials. Presenters from both preconferences and the main conference are encouraged to share!

What should I do?

Materials should be submitted via email to <mailto:SAS2023-talk@osf.io> (for talks) and <mailto:SAS2023-poster@osf.io> (for posters) formatted as follows:

Subject: Presentation title

Message body: Presentation summary (i.e., abstract) only. **Do not include a salutation or an email signature.**

Attachment: A file such as a PDF of your poster or talk (e.g., PowerPoint, PDF, etc.)

Note: If you already have an OSF account, send the email from the associated email address so it connects to your other projects.

The submitted materials will then be viewable on this page: <https://osf.io/meetings/SAS2023/>

How do I know the submission was successful? You will receive an email containing your permanent identifier, typically within a few minutes of submitting. Your materials should also be viewable on the OSF page. *If you do not receive an email or see your entry on the OSF repository, it was not successfully submitted.*

If unsuccessful, we recommend trying again and submitting only one smaller file (e.g., your 1-page abstract). You will be able to add more files later (see next section).

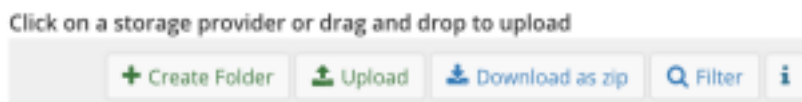
Can I upload a video? Yes! But OSF may not receive large files successfully. Luckily, if you submit just an abstract a “project” is created on OSF that you can add to.

If you wish to add a video file, wait until you receive the permanent identifier and login to OSF to modify the project. At that point, you may add files by doing the following:

1. Under the left-hand “Files” section click on:



2. Next, you should see the following bar appear under the files tab:



3. Upload additional files/organize as you see fit!

Is this Public? Yes, all files shared on the OSF repository are viewable by the general public. If you do not wish to share your presentation widely beyond the SAS meeting, do not upload to OSF.

Can I share only my abstract? You may share any part of your presentation you wish, including but not limited to your abstract, your ppt slides, your video, links to materials, etc. These materials are not considered peer-reviewed so you may upload updated versions of any materials.
